UJIRE: "God is the inner feeling related to heart. The basic principle of culture is Dharma. According to one's feelings and culture, one can visualise God," said Coimbatore Isha Foundation Founder Jagadish Vasudev.

Speaking at the inauguration of 76th Sarvadharmha sammelana as a part of Lakshdeepothsava in Dharmasthala, he said: "We worship God to fulfill our dreams and desires. Through dharma one will get Brahmananda."
